

Minutes of the Village of Galena Council Meeting February 24, 2025

On February 24, 2025 the Village of Galena meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in Council Chambers of the Village Hall, 109 Harrison St., by Mayor Kinnell.

Minutes of January 27, 2025 Council Meeting

Josh Porter made a motion to adopt the minutes of the January 27, 2025 Council meeting. Gillian Doucette seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously in a 6-0 voice vote.

Public Participation

Mary Howard, 1765 S. Galena Rd. asked about Ordinance 2025-09. Mayor Kinnell explained that we are working towards a self-service model consistent with other areas. He also explained that the Ordinance and discussion will occur later in the meeting. Ms. Howard also asked why everything is always an emergency or has emergency language. Mayor Kinnell responded that there maybe emergency language but it does not always mean it will be passed with one reading and declaring an emergency, some will be read three times but still have emergency language so it will take effect immediately and not having to wait 30 days.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Kinnell's reported that the third reading for the Joint Recreation District is tonight and Todd Musacchio and Halli Brownfield have been added as Galena's representatives. The Zoning Commission has worked through a final draft of our growth and land use plan and a public hearing is scheduled for the March Council meeting where Neighborhood Strategies will be at the meeting to answer questions.

Kathy Krupa brought up from the Planning and Zoning meeting that some commission members want to revisit the moratorium on home demolition.

Council President Report

Council President, Gillian Doucette recommended that we keep the old maintenance building, new maintenance building and the land purchased as separate projects instead of grouping it all together. Also,

coming up with projects for approval well in advance so not rushing legislation through at the last minute if possible.

Administrative Report

Tom Marshall, Village Administrator reported that he is working on performance reviews for staff, and the speed meters have been re-located to Walnut St and Harrison St. He is working with contractors for the Harrison St project, crosswalk, Miller Park improvements, and cemetery sign. New siding is going up on Village Hall, flagpole installation is complete and working on quotes for new maintenance building and demolition of old maintenance building.

Mike Fry asked about a sidewalk study being completed. Mr. Marshall responded that he will try to get a study completed before the next Council meeting.

Pete Casuccio asked whether all the flagpole lights were working because he didn't think the one in the Cemetery was working. Mr. Marshall said he would check all the lights.

Fiscal Officer Report

Fiscal Officer, Michelle Dearth, reported that two Cemetery plots were sold and there was one full burial. The development pass through invoices were sent out and there have been numerous inquiries about renting the Village Hall.

Zoning Officer Report

Matt Shock's report stated that the Blackhawk Phase-D inspection and maintenance agreement for the detention basin has been signed by the HOA and KEM will verify all remaining punch list items have been completed and then the final acceptance of the subdivision can be completed. Miller Farm section 1 public infrastructure is complete up to the pump station, pump station construction is ongoing. Miller Farm Section 2 development agreement was recently signed by the Village Administrator. Miller Farm Road Widening is complete except for finish grading and seeding.
